Master classes will be followed by panel discussions, moderated by John Schaefer (host of WNYC's New Sounds and Sound Check), addressing the unique challenges of collaborating across genres to create work that blends divergent performance and compositional practices. The panel will explore commonalities and differences among their ways of improvising and creating music, and discuss the artistic, cultural, and social implications of the ongoing crosspollination of jazz with a vast range of other music, including classical and folk music.
